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


### Objectives of the Study

Changas	Exchange of information is spontaneous. Generic topic	
Ub-ubfu	Communication process is focused on matters that are material to the group doing the ub-ubfu	
chuyas	Oral poetry, chants and spoken advise to celebrate and advise new couple	
utuy	Communication is done through chants and recitations to comfort family and recount the achievements and life story of the deceased	
Ap-apuy	Spontaneous, no specific agenda at hand	
funi	Healer acts of both sender, and medium of communication

# Indigenous Communication systems and modern yellow corn farming

Both Indigenous and "more modern" communication systems and institutions were crucial in disseminating information about yellow corn



## Changes in the Communication systems within the context of yellow corn industry

- 1. Evolution/loss of some language
- 2. Mixing of indigenous and exogenous communication systems
- 3. Economic activity = socioeconomic changes (mutual aid systems, customary conflict resolution systems, etc.)
- 4. Community Power relations (e.g. Rise of community elites

### Conclusion:

- Indigenous Channels of Communication have high credibility in their own communities
- Evolution and loss of some Language
- Disintegration of communication systems within the customary governance structure

- Rise of community elites and creating divide in the community
